This versatile and highly talented ensemble presents an evening showcasing some of the highlights of the chamber music repertoire. Richard Strauss's Sextet from the opera Capriccio, with its opulent harmonic palette and rich instrumental textures, will open the concert. This will be followed by Schubert's large scale Piano Trio No. 1 in Bb major, Op. 99, which was completed in 1828, in the last year of his life. The evening will culminate in a performance of Brahms' String Sextet No.2 in G major, Opus 36, a work noted for the exotic sounding opening of the first movement, by innovative chord structures and by its use of technical and melodic experimentation.

Since 1283, when Edward I began work on Conwy Castle, it has been the Parish Church. It contains many features of interest including a Tudor font and a magnificent rood screen of c. 1500. **'Singing in Secret – music from Recusant Renaissance England'**



Festival favourites, The Marian Consort, draw on the rich corpus of music written by William Byrd, England's greatest Renaissance composer for this concert. A devout Catholic, Byrd lived the life of an Elizabethan recusant and in his compositions provided a comprehensive compendium of music for the Catholic mass, which in the early 17th century was still being conducted in clandestine services held in the private houses of the Catholic nobility. More than this, many of Byrd's chosen motet texts, with their themes of desolation and a desire for divine intervention, have been seen to allude to the plight of Catholics in England during his lifetime. Interspersed with Byrd's music are motets by his contemporaries, many of whom shared his recusant sensibilities.

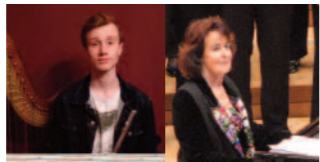

Under the direction of Paul Barritt, permanent Guest Leader of the Hallé Orchestra, and previously leader of the Northern Sinfonia and the English Chamber Orchestra, this wholly professional ensemble of players from some of the country's leading orchestras, will present a diverse programme of sparkling festival works. The evening will commence with Vaughan Williams' ever popular Fantasia on Greensleeves, and will be followed by another favourite, George Butterworth's 'The Banks of Green Willow'. Written in 1913, this poignant, lyrical piece has become almost a symbol of that long-lost halcyon Edwardian age, as if Butterworth were transcribing the disappearing world around him. In complete contrast, Shostakovich's exciting Concerto in C minor for Piano, Trumpet and String Orchestra, Op. 35, will follow. The evening will culminate in a performance of the least known of Beethoven's symphonies, the graceful Symphony No. 4 in Bb major, Op.60. Schumann called this work 'a slender Greek maiden between two Norse giants.'
